# The National Directory for Catechesis Those Who Catechize What Does It Say About Parents by Bryan Reising

The National Directory for Catechesis (NDC) is a great resource for parishes to understand the role of those who catechize: the pastor, the parish catechetical leader (PCL, formerly called the DRE or CRE), the parents, the catechists, and so on. I will take directly out of the NDC what it says about these various people and their role in catechizing and making sure catechetical formation is effective in the parish, in the Area Faith Community:

Parents are the most influential agents of catechesis for their children. They have a unique responsibility for the education of their children; they are the first educators, or catechists. They catechize primarily by the witness of their Christian lives and by their love for the faith. One way that

parents communicate Christian values and attitudes to their children is by loving each other within the context of a Christian marriage and their love for Christ and His Church. Their participation in the life of the parish – above all in the Sunday Eucharist – their willingness to evangelize and serve others, and their dedication to daily prayer demonstrates the authenticity of their profession of faith.

When children are baptized, their parents accept the responsibility to bring up their children in the practice of the faith and to see to it that the divine life that God gives them is kept safe from the poison of sin, to grow

always stronger in their hearts. At the same time, the Church promises to help parents foster their children's faith and assists the specifically in their role as catechists of their

children, whether they assume complete responsibility themselves or look to the parish school or religious education program for help and support.

Parish life itself is an aid to parents because it is here, at the Eucharistic banquet, that they are nourished by Christ himself. The vibrancy of the parish community and the example of generous love and service of parishioners strengthens parents in the faith.

Adult catechesis, designed especially for parents, also helps them nourish their own faith, as well as that of their children. Such programs help parents to understand important issues in their own lives and the lives of their children, such as the preparation for reception of the sacraments or the questions raised by particular moral concerns in the light of the Catholic faith. This enables them to practice the faith in their everyday lives. These programs that prepare parents whose children will be receiving the sacraments should encourage parents to ensure that their children receive formal catechetical instruction in programs sponsored by the parish.

Integrated throughout the NDC, there are other aspects that the parents need to be aware of like what does it say about homeschooling, Catholic schools, and prayer in the home. This important document helps all to understand their roles.

#### **Preparing Spiritually for Christmas**

Greetings in Christ Everyone and Blessed Advent as we await in blessed hope!

Advent, the first season of the liturgical year, helps us to

prepare the way of the Lord, prepare for the commemoration of the birth of Christ, the Incarnation of God himself; to prepare for Christ coming into our lives here and now; and to prepare for Christ to come again at the end of time.

So yes – there are Christmas cards to send, Christmas presents to buy and ship, Christmas parties to attend, and of course, baking and cooking, decorating the home for Christmas during this season.

But how can we prepare spiritually?

**Prayer** each day is the best thing we can do in this very busy world. Liturgy of the Hours, the rosary, daily Mass, devotional prayer (many parishes offer

a daily reflection Advent booklet), mealtime prayers focused on Advent themes, prayer around the Advent wreath, and

special Advent retreats are possibilities for both individuals and families.

Acts of Charity are another means to prepare. There are a wide range of activities one can be involved with: from shoveling an elderly neighbor's snow to going to the Twin Cities to do some service like feeding the hungry. There can be activities where the whole family can be involved like delivering meals on wheels or activities that individuals can do like knitting hats and scarves for those who lack these items. Then there are things that we can do that have a global reach, like giving to Catholic Relief Service so that they can provide clean water to more people. Whether you are a Confirmation candidate or someone who is already confirmed, doing acts of charity is part of living the Christian life.

### Religious Education Safe Environment Compliance Reminders

Any DRE, youth minister, catechist, adults helping with youth ministry, or anyone who may be in a ministry with minors is required to be in total compliance with safe environment requirements.

Some catechist lists received have included individuals who have not yet completed any diocesan Safe Environment requirements. Please double-check with your local SEC to make sure everyone in your programs is fully up-to-date.

The four areas of compliance [a condition of employment or volunteer service] are:

- 1) Have a background check before beginning employment or volunteer service.
- 2) Sign forms A & B of the 2007 diocesan sexual misconduct policy before beginning employment or volunteer service.
- 3) Attend a VIRTUS training session before beginning employment or volunteer service. If there is a serious reason that prevents attendance prior to employment or volunteer service, a grace period of 60 days is allowed, but this only pertains to long term ministries lasting a school or catechetical year.
- 4) Each individual is to complete online training as assigned. Regarding the online training, it is to be completed within 30 days of being posted to the VIRTUS account. Communicate with your volunteers to complete the online training as soon as possible. It takes approximately 10 minutes (or less) to do the training and answer the questions at the end.

MakeUp Sessions for the Students' Training need to be completed by the end of February and turned in by March 1, 2015. The results are to be incorporated on the absentee form.

Absentee rates need to be at 5% or below. Student Training forms should all be turned in by now to the Safe Environment Office.

Remember to use only diocesan forms. And thank you for keeping our children and youth safe!
