DISQUALIFYING CRIMES OR CONDUCT

To the Priests, Religious, and People of the Diocese of New Ulm:

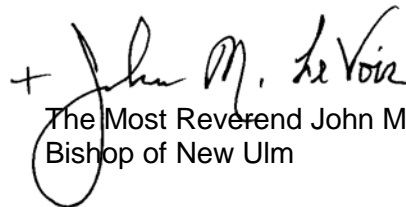
The background checks processed by the Diocese are bound by the Fair Credit Reporting Act (FCRA), federal law on consumer reporting agencies, and Minnesota statutes pertaining to Access to Consumer Reports (Chapter 13C). The Fair Credit Reporting Act establishes strict guidelines that must be followed if a person is negatively treated based on information obtained in a background check.

When a disqualifying crime or conduct becomes known through a diocesan background check, the Bishop's Delegate in Matters Pertaining to Sexual Misconduct or the diocesan Safe Environment Coordinator will determine if the crime or conduct is disqualifying for the person to continue or begin ministry, employment and/or volunteer with the Diocese.

Disqualifying behavior will be based on the current Minnesota state statute of Disqualifying Crimes or Conduct of the Minnesota Human Resource Department. See Appendix I for the current MN Statute 245C.15.

After determining that a crime or conduct is disqualifying, the procedure in compliance with the FCRA which the Diocese will follow, is found in the Safe Environment Manual.
