Ovulation Method CrM Fertility*Care*

The Creighton Model (CrM) Fertility*Care* System is a standardized modification of the Billings Ovulation Method that has significant medical applications. CrM Fertility*Care* relies upon the observation and charting of biological markers, including cervical mucus, the most accurate sign of fertility, providing an understanding of a woman's health and fertility.

Observations of these biomarkers allows:

- Couples to use the method both to achieve and to avoid pregnancy.
- Cooperation with NaproTechnology, a new reproductive science, to identify and treat conditions such as: infertility, miscarriage, hormone problems, PMS, ovarian cysts and unusual bleeding.

CrM FertilityCare instruction in the spirit of the teachings of Pope Paul VI and John Paul II provides the truly Catholic view of human sexuality and respect for the total person. It assists couples to realize the challenge laid out in the Theology of the Body – to understand and respond to the innate language of the body that expresses total reciprocal self giving in love of husband and wife.

Instruction is initiated by contacting one of the CrM Fertility*Care* practitioners on the contact list. A schedule of individual teaching classes is set up with each couple, allowing for personalized instruction that results in maximum confidence in the use of the method. Likewise it offers a greatly appreciated flexibility in scheduling. Instruction is geared to use of the method throughout the woman's whole reproductive life time and provides opportunities for ongoing instruction throughout all phases of that life time, including postpartum and premenopause.

Instruction consists of eight follow-up sessions which allow for a complete initial instruction, followed by increasingly independent use of the method that addresses all natural variations that take place in the woman's cycle over time.

Sympto-Thermal Method Couple to Couple League

The Couple to Couple League (CCL) teaches three basic signs of fertility — temperature, mucus and cervix — and how to apply this knowledge both to achieve and to avoid pregnancy. The multiple signs of the Sympto-Thermal Method (STM) provide flexibility for individual situations and help couples grow in confidence.

We teach NFP within the moral constructs of the Magisterium of the Catholic Church, with an emphasis on the teachings of Pope John Paul II and the Theology of the Body. Couples learn of God's vision and plan for marriage and family, and how to live out their sexuality while respecting the dignity of each other and their union. The health and safety benefits of NFP are contrasted with the side effects and dangers of artificial contraception. Review of effectiveness data further supports its use.

CCL classes are taught by professionally-trained volunteer couples who have witnessed the benefits of NFP in their own marriage. They offer practical suggestions for making the practice of NFP a team effort involving both spouses.

A course series consists of three classes spaced one month apart. Supplemental classes for the postpartum and premenopause transitions are also offered.

The Teaching Couple provides ongoing chart review and consultation until each student couple is comfortable and confident in their personal NFP use. This follow-up continues after the series, if needed.

Sympto-Thermal Method NFP International

Natural Family Planning International (NFPI) offers instruction in two distinct, yet complementary, forms of NFP: the Sympto-Thermal Method and Ecological Breastfeeding.

The Sympto-Thermal Method is easy-to-learn and highly effective. Couples learn to observe multiple common symptoms (such as temperature, mucus, and physical changes in the cervix); this often gives them more confidence in using the method.

Ecological Breastfeeding is a form of child care that normally spaces babies about two years apart on the average.
